A child welfare Officer is appointed on an annual basis who is responsible for administering and ensuring compliance with the requirements of the Safe Hands Child welfare policy.

The Child Welfare Officer will be an executive position and have a permanent position on the club council and associated committees.

Primary duties of the Club Child Welfare Officer


The Child Welfare Officer will

- Be the first point of contact at the club for the reporting of child welfare and protection concerns
- Assist in the raising of awareness of members, parents, volunteers and others involved in Cricket at the club in respect of child protection
- Be a source of advice and information at the club
- Uphold confidentiality as far as is practically possible in all child protection matters
